away from farm communities, and rob farmers of their equity and retirement, they are evil. Each nation should have food sovereignty and be free to implement policies that work for their own farmers.

Thirdly, while Bailey is correct that import issues are complex, that is no excuse not to explain them in lay terms. The tanker load illustrations attempt to do this. No one making these illustrations has claimed that all of this milk is arriving in tankers. The illustrations concern how

much domestic milk is being displaced by imports. Actually, to say that we don't import tankerloads of milk is incorrect. A significant number of tanker-loads of farm milk do cross the border from Canada.
