Ohio Scientists Promote Animal Nutrition South Of The Border

WOOSTER, Ohio—Three animal sciences professors with the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center (OARDC) have made a difference for people in the Latin American food-animal industry.

For the past eight years, Bill Weiss, Jeff Firkins, and Don Mahan have taught courses on dairy cattle and swine nutrition at the Escuela Centroamericana de Ganaderia (ECAG), a livestock production technical institute based in the rural community of Atenas, Costa Rica.


