Pennsylvania 4-H Members Win **National Egg & Poultry Awards**

UNIVERSITY PARK (Centre Pennsylvania youths Co.) fared well in egg-judging and poultry knowledge competitions at the recent National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference in Louis-

Maria Sanner of Somerset County won first place in the National 4-H Egg Cookery Presentation Contest, which involved preparing an egg dish and giving an oral presentation on egg quality standards, preparation, versatility and nutritional value. The win was the first for a Pennsylvania 4-H member at a national poultry competition. Somerset County 4-H volunteer leader Theresa Sanner served as chaperone and coach.

A Pennsylvania team also placed seventh in the doubleelimination National Avian Bowl Contest. The team included Corry Calderone, Jili McClure and Rebecca Stottlemyer, all from Washington County, and was coached by Washington County 4-H volunteer leaders Jenna Dunmire and Mary Fidler.

The national conference brought together more than 150 senior 4-H members from 25 states for team competitions in poultry and egg judging and in the Avian Bowl poultry knowledge contest. In addition, individuals competed in egg preparation, turkey barbecuing and chicken barbecuing events.

Most of the coupons in these books are from businesses in or around the Carlisle area (94 in Carlisle alone). Five dollars to \$11 per book comes back to the 4-H, depending on how many books are sold.

Profits from the Bonus Book sale will support the county 4-H Development Fund and local 4-H clubs. The 4-H Development Fund helps to pay transportation costs, at least half of 4-H event registration fees and achievement night awards, as well as support for adult volunteer training, and much more.

Lycoming County Extension Offers 4-H Tractor Safety Course

MONTOURSVILLE (Lycoming Co.) — Farming is a way of life for many Pennsylvanians. Too often it is also a way of death or injury as well. Any girl or boy, 14 or 15 years of age, must successfully complete proper certification if they plan to operate a farm tractor or machinery on a farm other than their own family

A certification course is beginning March 11 from 6-8 p.m. and will be conducted at Valley Ag and Turf in Watsontown. The course is scheduled for Tuesday

evenings and will continue through April 29. Participants will be asked to pay for only the cost of the manual (\$7.50). Videos, hands-on training and practical driving experience will be featured.

Any girl or boy, 14 or 15 years of age, must successfully complete this course in order to work for someone other than their own family farm. Thirteen year olds may take the course and take the test, but will not receive a certificate until they reach age 14.


must preregister for spaces in the indoor and pole barn areas; outdoor areas will be allocated on the day of the event.


