BOXED BEEF CUTS: Boxed beef steady to weak on moderate demand and offerings. Select and Choice rib, chuck, and round cuts generally steady, while loin cuts weak. Beef trimmings higher on moderate demand and light offerings.

Estimated composite cutout value of Choice 1-3, 600-750 lbs carcasses dn .33 at 126.13, 750-900 lbs dn 13 at 124.42; Select 1-3, 600-750 lbs dn .16 at 118.60, 750-900 lbs dn .50 at 117.98; based on 177.80 loads of Choice cuts, 113.32 loads of Select cuts, 53.16 loads of trimmings, and 66.95 loads of coarse ground trimmings.

Estimated carcass price equivalent value of Choice 1-3, 600-750 lbs dn .16 at 117.49, 750-900 lbs dn .04 at 116.26; Select 1-3, 600-750 lbs dn .09 at 109.73, 750-900 lbs dn .31 at 109.33. Current index reflects the equivalent of 256,211 head of cattle.

NATIONAL 5 DAY-ROLLING CUT-TFR COW CUTOUT: The Cutter cow carcass gross cutout value was estimated at 87.78 up 1.70.

By-Product Drop Value: Hide and offal from a typical slaughter steer was estimated at 8.05, unchanged.

NATIONAL CARLOT PORK: Sales reported on 95.8 loads of pork cuts and 17.0 loads of trim/process pork. Weekly Meat Production Under Federal Inspection

WASHINGTON, D.C., Feb. 14 - (USDA-NASS) - Total red meat production under federal inspection for the week ending Saturday, Feb. 15, was estimated at 859.9 million lb, according to the USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service. This was 2.7% lower than a week ago and 1.3% lower than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 1.2% lower compared to the previous year.

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
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
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
