NATIONAL FFFDFR & STOCKFR SUMMARY for week ending Feb 28 — Receipts 263,900, last week 333,700 Direct 55,900, last week 46,100 Video/ Internet 4,600; last week 38,000. Auctions 203,400; last week 249,600. This week's reported auction volume included 58 percent over 600 lbs and 44 percent heiters

Compared to last week, feeder cattle sold mostly steady as severe wintry weather dictated trading activity Punxsutawney Phil wasnt kidding when he said six more weeks of winter. Many areas saw their worst weather, so far this winter, and very few regions escaped the grip of numerous storms that covered the US from coast to coast Perhaps the hardest hit area stretched across the Plains states of Oklahoma and Kansas, eastward to the Ozarks of northern Arkansas and southern Missouri But, record low temperatures were set as far north as Montana and ice-storms froze areas as far south as Louisiana and south Texas Several large livestock auction markets were forced to cancel this weeks sales, including the Joplin Regional Stockyards. Other big markets saw significantly reduced receipts, during a week when Kansas, Oklahoma, and Texas Panhandle salebarns should be busting at the seams with wheat cattle. Country feeder trading was moderate this week in the wheat pasture regions and most 750-800 lb steers are selling in a fairly narrow range of 76.00-78.00. This sounds pretty cheap as feedlots sell green fat cattle at 80.00, for the second week in row.

Feeder buyers are showing extreme reserve, after several years of unexplainable and unhedgable prices. Many attribute this trend to the loss of equity in the feeding sector and the instruction by financial providers to secure complete downside protection.

Stocker prices were largely steady this week with a few spots of improvement noted, especially on fancy strings in the Northern Plains. The Southeastern calf market was very volatile this week as wet and muddy conditions halted local livestock movement, not to mention the harsh conditions their western customers were enduring. Maybe this was the final winter-blast and spring weather will soon bring the wheaties to town and set the Southern trucks rolling west with summer grazers.
