NATIONAL YOUNG TURKEY PARTS AND BULK MEAT, Frozen, unless specified, cents per lb, delivered first receivers, part and full trucklots, as of Mar. 4. The trade sentiment on fresh tom breast meat and fresh destrapped tenderloins was steady to fully steady with some sellers actively trying to move the market up, fully steady on fresh wing meat and scapula. The trade sentiment on frozen wing meat and frozen destrapped tenderloins was steady to fully steady, frozen tom breast meat -3 months age fully steady, -6 months age barely steady. Fresh white meat demand was light to moderate with wing meat and scapula the most active. Offerings of fresh white meat were limited on scapula and breast trim, light to adequate on tom breast meat and destrapped tenderloins. Frozen white meat offerings from new production were generally held with confidence, meanwhile, some willingness to negotiate on older production was noted. The undertone was mostly steady on rib breasts for the slow to moderate inquiry. Trading was light on all items. Fresh scapula traded at 65 cents delivered domestic and frozen tom breast meat (-3 months age) 110 cents delivered export.
