Bickel, part of the Hoof Printers 4-H club, with 30-40 participants, has been to states eight times and been in 4-H for 11 years.


"I'm happy to be here," said Bickel. "It's a reward at the end of the year for me, to know that I put in all this hard work and this is what I can get from it."
