# Antique Detective

When the blown three-mold process was first made in America around 1820, decanters (and other pieces) were turned out in dozens of patterns. In colorless glass, prices can be \$100 to \$300.

Decanter jugs and ewers, popular in England and France have a different look. They can be identified by their tall neck, large looped handles and lipped mouth. The ewers often came with matching basins and were mounted in various metals.

In the 1870s elaborate cut glass decanters became the fashion; and the 1876 Philadelphia Centennial inspired patriotic motifs and symbols.

Collector's look for pieces that can be attributed to Christian Doring's Pennsylvania glassworks.

Around the turn-of-the 19th century, the popularity of colorful Victorian art glass was also used for decanters and other drink servers. Art Nouveau swirled designs were often executed in silver deposit on colored glass. Decanters became expensive when they combined glass with silver mountings from Tiffany or Gorham.

**CLUES:** There have been reproductions of some of the pressed glass decanters in the strawberry and diamond pattern. The oldies have a gray cast. There are also reprints of the early three-ring English decanters as well as cranberry glass and color-cut overlay glass.

Hands-on comparisons or a knowledgeable dealer are musts if you want to spend big bucks. However, if you see something cheap take a chance and use it for research.
