Wheat bids were pressured by moisture reported in the hard red winter wheat growing areas overnight and today. South Korea's wheat purchase overnight was not enough to push bids higher. Corn bids were slightly higher on optimism for better than expected weekly export sales numbers tomorrow. Recent declines in corn pits have also been seen as overdone. Soybean bids failed to hold on to Tuesday's sharp advances as fund selling on the Board pressured bids. Talks of another possible US sale to China, limited losses. Wheat steady to 4 cents lower. Corn 1 to 3 cents higher. Sorghum 3 cents higher. Soybeans 3 to 7 cents lower.

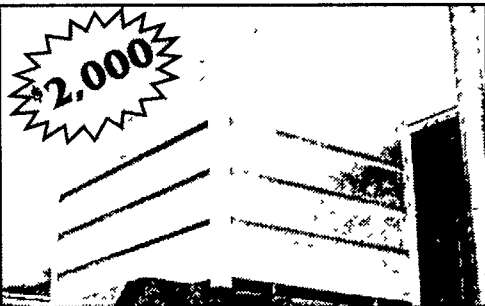

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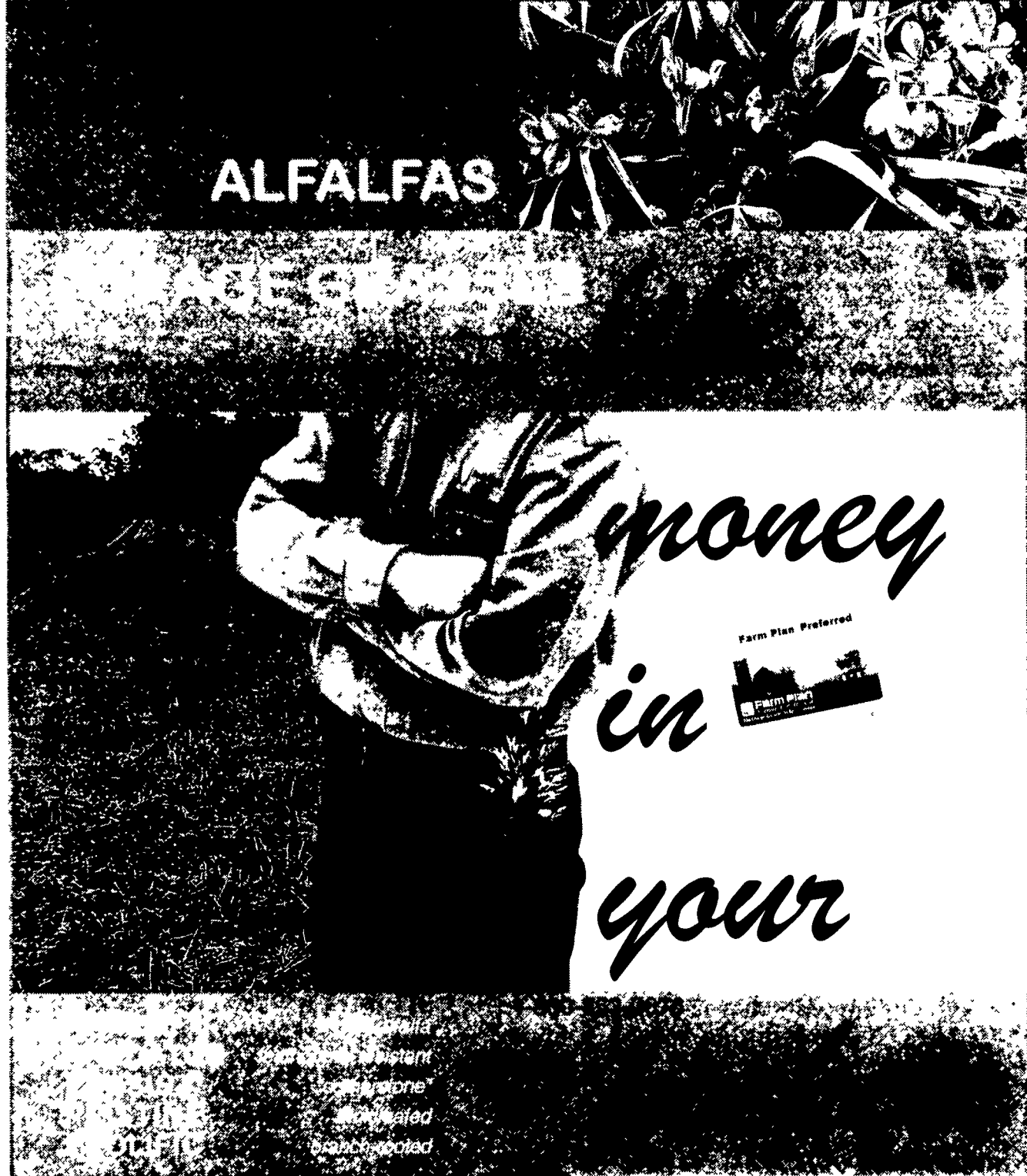
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
