

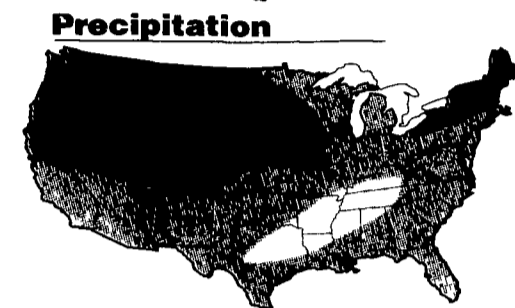
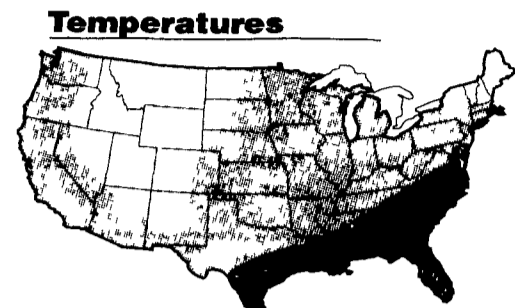

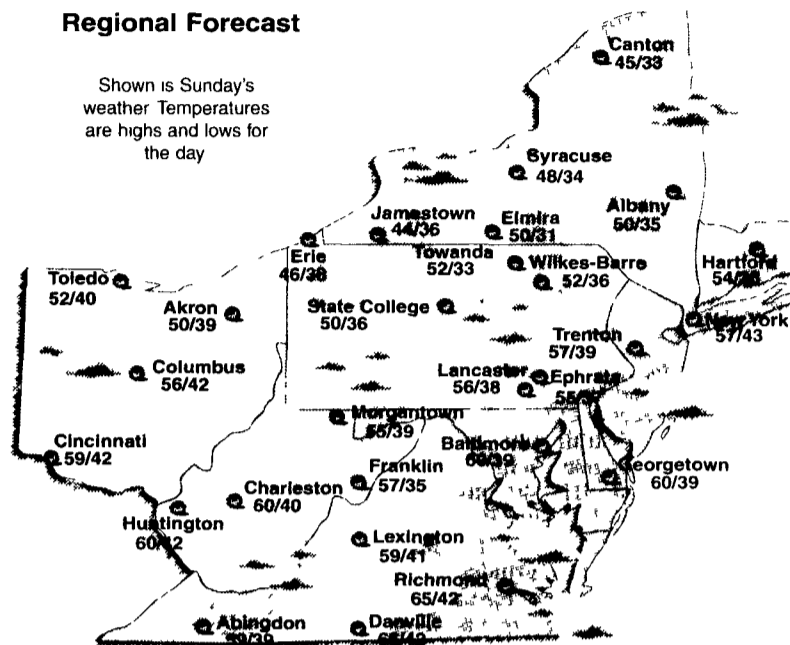

Regional Forecast

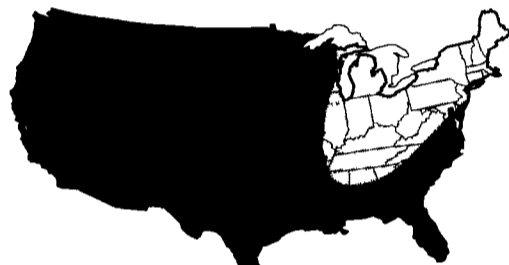
Shown is Sunday's weather. Temperatures are highs and lows for the day.



Last Week's Precipitation Lancaster

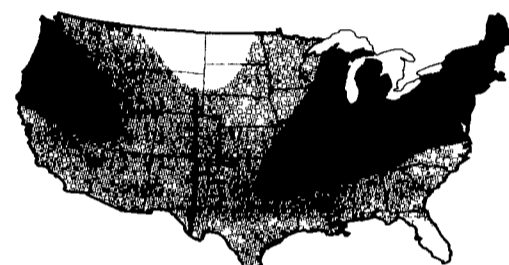

30-Day Precipitation Outlook

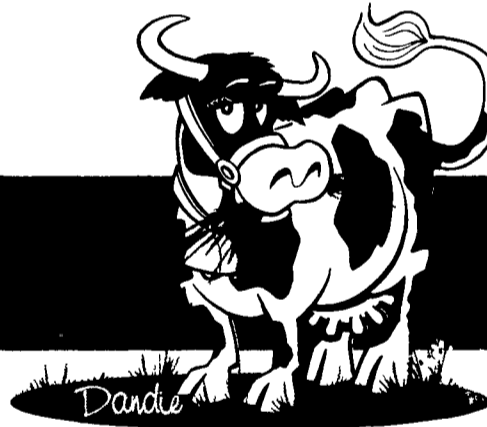
