Frederickson, NFU Government Relations Representative Tracy Beckman and Pennsylvania Farmers Union President Larry Breech will provide an overview of congressional actions, upcoming dairy events, and possible remedies to the dairy crisis.

BROOKVILLE (Jefferson their products since 1979, and unfortunately, economic projections are not showing an increase in prices for the coming months," said Breech. "Both producers and consumers are loosing the fight on this issue."

"Milk prices are well below the cost of production and it is having a devastating effect on our rural economies," Breech said. "Our dairy producers are producing millions of gallons of milk per year, yet are unable to make a profit, while dairy manufacturers continue to profit year after year."

Farmers^{**}Union has been urging Congress to hold hearings to determine whether a lack of market competition within the dairy industry is resulting in price gouging for both consumers and producers. NFU, along with a coalition of other groups, will conduct a dairy fly-in in Washington, D.C., April 7-9 to address the negative impacts of imported milk protein concentrates.
