"The cows are there in the freestalls, and if they are good they'll rise to the top," said Mike Ammon, who manages the herd and handles sire selection and bull marketing. "(Freestalls) are where most cows are. We don't

"We don't breed for show," he said. "The goal is to provide functional, profitable cows.'


The group also visited the herds of Paul Neer, Mel Peachey, Keith and Kent Spicher, and Vernon Yoder, all in the Belleville area.

Paul Neer is a full-time hoof trimmer who recently began


building a purebred herd, Pencroft Holsteins, housed in a rented dairy barn near Belleville. At this point he keeps about 20 cows in the tiestall setup.
