Perry County Youth Sought For Dairy Promotion

NEW BLOOMFIELD (Perry Co.) — The Perry County Dairy Promotion Committee is seeking males and females ages 6 to 24 to help in the promotion of nature's most perfect food — MILK!

Girls aged 16 to 24 can vie for the title of Perry County Dairy Princess. Girls or boys aged 14 and 15 can serve as a Dairy Ambassador, while girls 12 and 13 serve as a Dairy Maid. Girls aged 9-11 can serve as a Dairy Miss, while girls age 6-8 can serve as a Lil' Dairy Miss.

The age the girl will be on July 1, will determine what position she may hold. All of these positions offer a chance to promote milk and milk products as well as meet many new and interesting people on the local and state level.

Girls are eligible to seek the title of Perry County Dairy Princess if they are a Perry County resident and meet at least one of the following criteria: is a daughter of either a dairy farmer, farm manager or herdsman, or someone employed in a dairy related industry; employed by a dairy related business; have at least 2 head of dairy animals in a 4-H or FFA contest prior to May 1; or was a Dairy Maid or Dairy Ambassador for 1 full year.

The Dairy Princess must be at least 16 by July 1, and will not reach her 24th birthday by Dec. 31. A candidate must have her parent's consent if under 18, be

single, never have been married or had children and is not allowed to marry during her reign. She will be eligible to compete for the title of Pennsylvania Dairy Princess at the state pageant in Harrisburg in September.

In order to compete for the title of Pennsylvania Dairy Princess, the Perry County Dairy Princess must attend the Pennsylvania Dairy Princess and Promotion Service's training seminar July 8-11, in Williamsport, PA. All candidates for Perry County Dairy Princess will be required to present a 3 to 5 minute skit and give a 3 to 5 minute speech on the dairy industry or related topics at the Perry County Dairy Princess Pageant to be held June 7, at the Perry Valley Grange, Millerstown.

Dairy Ambassadors and Dairy Maids need to live in Perry County, be a genuine milk drinker and user of REAL dairy products, be the child of a dairy farmer, dairy farm manager or employee, own dairy cattle or be the child, grand-child, niece, nephew, sister, or brother of someone employed full-time in a dairy related industry.
