HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Carlisle Clark, Hustontown, and "CRCF Lil Firecracker" took home grand champion female honors at the Pennsylvania Farm Show' Red Angus Show. The heifer first topped the February calf division.

A two-year veteran of the Farm Show, he has exhibited cattle for five years.

Carlisle is the son of Jack and Tina Clark, Clark Farms. The Clarks purchased the calf's mother already bred.

The family is not new to the Farm Show winner's circle. Carlisle's brother Jack took home grand champion steer honors in 2001.

The family's operation includes 300 head of cattle — 150 registered Angus and Red Angus — and the remainder feedlot cattle.
