Compared to last week, a slaughter pig trend was not fully established due to the light run last week. U.S. 1-2 20-30 lb slaughter pigs sold with a firmer undertone, while the 30-40 lb supply trended with a lower undertone. Buyer attendance and bidding were both moderate. There was some light interest from feeder buyers, although 87 percent of the supply went to slaughter. All pigs were weighed and graded on arrival and sold by the hundred weights.


