National Egg Market At A Glance Atlanta, Ga. April 9, 2003

Report Supplied By USDA In New York, prices advanced 2 cents on mediums while the balance of sizes remained unchanged. Prices in all other locations were unchanged, but were trending higher on mediums. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand at retail outlets was usually in a range of moderate to good. Supplies were fully sufficient to tight with mediums in the least

available position. Breaking stock supplies were about adequate to adequate for the moderate demand. Light type hens were sufficient for regular slaughter schedules.

National Retail Egg Purchases Átlanta, Ga. April 4, 2003

Report Supplied By USDA Cooperators estimate orders for the week ending April 11 will increase by 15 percent. Present week purchases for the week ending Apr. 4 were 248,380 cases which was 3 percent below the prior week and 2 percent above estimates.

CASES PURCHASED: CARTONED: 206,624 --- -1%; LOOSE: 41,756 --- -12%; TOTAL: 248,380 - -3%.

Comparison figures are compiled on a matched plant basis. Purchases and estimates by 16 cooperators; 30 dozen cases or equivalent.


