In New York, prices advanced 2 cents on mediums while the balance of sizes remained unchanged. Prices in all other locations were unchanged, but were trending higher on mediums. The market tone was steady to fully steady. Demand at retail outlets was usually in a range of moderate to good. Supplies were fully sufficient to tight with mediums in the least available position. Breaking stock supplies were about adequate to adequate for the moderate demand. Light type hens were sufficient for regular slaughter schedules.

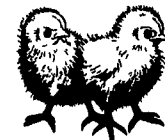

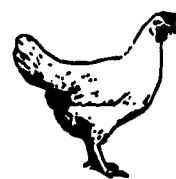

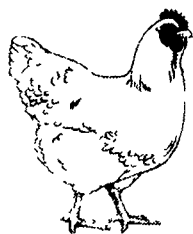
