


Collectible American Patriotic Symbols

Since the September 11 terrorism attacks there has been not only a revived interest in artifacts reflecting America's patriot symbols but also newly created objects.

Pins, banners, and flag jewelry as well as peace dove pins are everywhere. The handbags and tee shirts with the stars and stripes motif are among the many collectibles of tomorrow. Even some

of the humble items found in catalogs like flag motif dishes and door mats are put-away possibilities. As with most collectibles some are downright ugly while others are beautiful.

This interest has been reflected in Americana auctions and in antique shops specializing in 18th, 19th, and early 20th century objects.

There is even a new Price Guide, "Official Price Guide to American Patriotic Memorabilia" by Michael Polak, a collector.

A collection can go in many directions. Not only can it specialize in antique or contemporary objects, but concentrate on art, artifacts and decorative objects, to mention a few. A contemporary collection could focus on items made after September 11, from anti-Bin Laden posters and banners to glass and weavings. One of my favorite discoveries was in a North Carolina rifle shop. A hand-painted dart board with Bin Laden's likeness and red, white and blue darts. This can be the folk art of tomorrow.

Doubtless there will more individually-made symbols.

There's nothing new about patriotic symbols. They've been around since and before the American Revolution. The eagle was (and is) the most popular liberty symbol. From the War of 1812 until after the Civil War, it and other pa-
