In the parts structure, trading for mid-
week was light to fair. Wings were bal-
anced to tight with increased interest, ten-
ders were sufficient to close, and the re-
maining items were readily available. In
production areas, live supplies were moder-
ate at desirable to heavy weights.

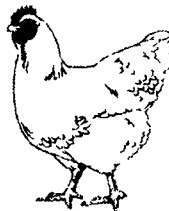

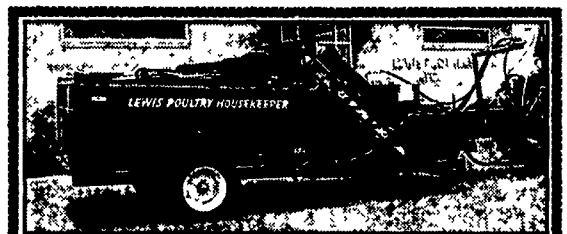
