she said. Menhennett also plans to sell sheep skins, besides adding soft herbed cheese and soft garlic cheese as new additions to her offerings.

This year Menhennett and Cook will take more than 300 individual cheeses to the event. The bigger portions are sold in pound sizes, but there are quarter pound packages, also.

Prices for the cheese hover around \$12 a pound. The cheese is also popular for customers who are lactose-intolerant, he said.

Although the demand is there, expansion is currently not an option.

"We're doing it as more a labor of love than anything else," he said. "We just do it because we like to do it. We like to have fun, so we're not going to scale


