DOMESTIC MARKET HIGHLIGHTS: Trade sentiment was steady at best on retail sized hens, mostly steady on toms. Offers were fully adequate for the limited buyers interest. Supplies of breast meat and trims were easily obtainable. Cooked and deli demand improved but was not up to expectations. Trading was fairly good on plant grade and A grade 4-8 pound breasts at steady prices. Plant grade basted 16-18 pound breasts traded at 80 cents.

EXPORT MARKET HIGHLIGHTS: Trade activity was moderate on hen and tom thigh meat, light on tom drums, wings and v-type wings. Tom hand cut defatted gizzards moved at 46 cents delivered port.

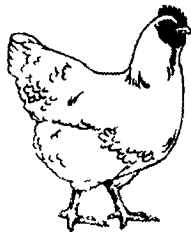
