Calves: Compared to Tuesday, veal calves sold mostly steady to 3.00 lower. Holstein bull calves going into special fed veal barns sold sharply higher as the bulk of the graded supply sold over 200.00 in extremely active trading. Just to note how great the demand was, the Number Two bulls sold at a 10.00-35.00 premium to the Number One bulls. It is next to impossible to pencil out paying 200.00-260.00 for 90-125 lb bulls when the finished market is currently reported from mostly 182.00-188.00. The PA Department of Ag graded 298 head of bulls for the graded sale, with an estimated 98 percent of the run going back on feed.

Compared to last week, slaughter steers sold

2.00-4.00 higher for the week due to the very good demand and active trading. Finished steer prices have never been this high in Lancaster County as packages of Prime steers on Thursday were trading up to 86.00. The supply in the county remains relatively thick, with most producers not hesitating to bring their steers to

town to get in on the hot market, regardless of their finish. However, most of the cattle this week were very well finished, and looked more like the Lancaster County runs the area is known for. Nationally, boxed beef cutout values have been extremely bullish as a 7.00 increase was noted through Thursday. The western direct feedyards moved steers 1.00-2.00 higher this week at mostly 80.00, and 127.00-128.00 in the meat. Holstein steers sold 1.00-2.00 higher early in the week, trading mixed late as most of the demand was for the high Choice and Prime spots. Slaughter heifer runs were very light this week, and trends were not established. Breaking and Boning cows sold 1.00-3.00 lower early in the week due to the lighter buyer attendances, with Lean slaughter cows able to hold near steady. However, the late week demand for the fleshier cows remains good as all classes sold 1.00-3.00 higher. The cow supplies in the county are getting lighter, which is playing a hand in the higher market. The quality of the cows has been mixed, but noted as very good on Thursday as a nice supply of fleshy cows has been available for several weeks. Slaughter bulls sold steady to 2.00 higher for the week. The reported supply this week included 1067 head of steers, 85 heifers, 813 cows, 146 bulls, with the balance made up of 183 head of feeder cattle.

Calf Summary: Compared to last week, veal calves sold mostly steady to 10.00 higher. Holstein bull calves suitable for special fed veal barns sold 10.00-20.00 lower on Monday, trending steady to 20.00 higher at the Tuesday graded run. However, the real bell ringer came late in the week as prices were sharply higher. Number One and Number Two graded bulls all sold over 200.00, with demand so good that the Number Two supply sold at over a 30.00 premium to the Number One's. Holstein heifers are also once again a hot commodity as prices were up to over 450.00 by week's end. It's hard to pencil out paying over 200.00 for 90-125 lb bulls when the finished market was reported from 182.00-188.00 this week on a carcass basis; which is mostly steady on light to moderate demand and offerings. Contract calves slaughtered this week were hung up from mostly 185.00-190.00. The PA Department of Agriculture graded 730 head of bulls and heifers this week, compared to 704 head last week.
