

Two very important statistical reports were released this past week. The first was the Milk Pro-

duction Report. It indicated that the nation's milk supply is still growing, but at a much slower rate. The second was the Cold Storage Report. It showed the opposite - inventory is growing, particularly for butter.

First, the Milk Production Report. Once again, milk production is growing relative to year-
