**TRY A PAPAYA**

**Why a papaya? Because it's King Kamehameha I Day (June 11) in Hawaii, honoring the warrior king who unified the Hawaiian chain of islands early in the 19th century. Festivities in Hawaii run at least a week, from the lei-draping of the Kamehameha statue in Honolulu to various parades, surfing and windsurfing events, and music festivals. The Fourth of July also traditionally marks a great series of events, including the paniolo (Hawaiian cowboys) hosting their famous rodeos. The Makawao Rodeo, in the Maui town of Makawao, is just one of many, with riding, roping, country music, dancing, and Hawaiian-style rodeo clowns.**
