OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS, Weekly Cattle Summary — Compared to last week: Feeder steers steady to 1.00 lower. Feeder heifers steady to 2.00 lower. Demand good for front-end cattle, moderate for increased supply of Brahma Crosses. Demand held strong throughout another long day despite some difficulties obtaining trucks. Some feedlots are near capacity. However, demand remains strong due to current feedlot profits on slaughter cattle along with accelerated turnover. Cattle and calves steady with good demand. Quality of stockers rather attractive for kind or condition. Flesh conditions of feeders continues to harden and improve for buyers. Receipts: this week 18,439; last week 20,923; last year 14,385.
