Choice loin cuts sharply lower, while Select loin cuts lower. Beef trimmings generally steady on moderate demand and offerings.

Estimated composite cutout value of Choice 1-3, 600-750 lbs carcasses down 1.49 at 138.89, 750-900 lbs down 1.24 at 139.10; Select 1-3, 600-750 lbs down .60 at 127.12,

750-900 lbs down .75 at 126.65; based on 161.69 loads of Choice cuts, 137.52 loads of Select cuts, 21.76 loads of trimmings, and 74.61 loads of coarse ground trimmings.

Estimated carcass price equivalent value of Choice 1-3, 600-750 lbs down .78 at 125.61, 750-900 lbs down .62 at 125.74; Select 1-3, 600-750 lbs down .31 at 112.45, 750-900 lbs down .40 at 112.16. Current index reflects the equivalent of 312,778 head of cattle.

NATIONAL 5 DAY-ROLLING CUTTER COW CUTOUT: The Cutter cow carcass gross cutout value was estimated at 86.15, up 2.26.

By-Product Drop Value: Hide and offal from a typical slaughter steer was estimated at 7.77, up .01.

NATIONAL CARLOT PORK: Sales reported on 43.0 loads of pork cuts and 23.5 loads of trim/process pork. Compared to Monday's close: Fresh loins weak to 3.00 lower; butts 1.00-3.00 higher; skinned hams generally steady; seedless bellies mostly 3.00 higher; lean trimmings steady to 2.00 lower. 
