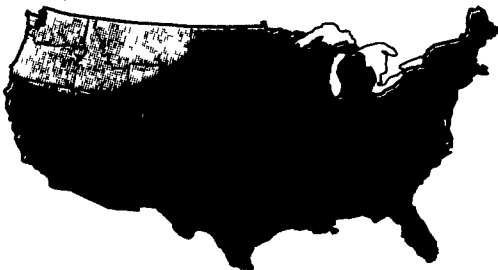

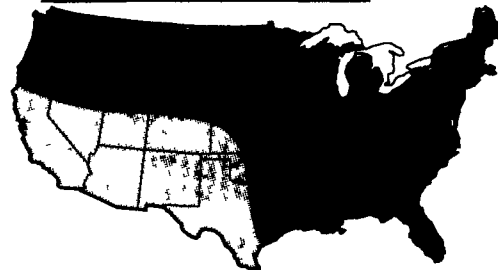

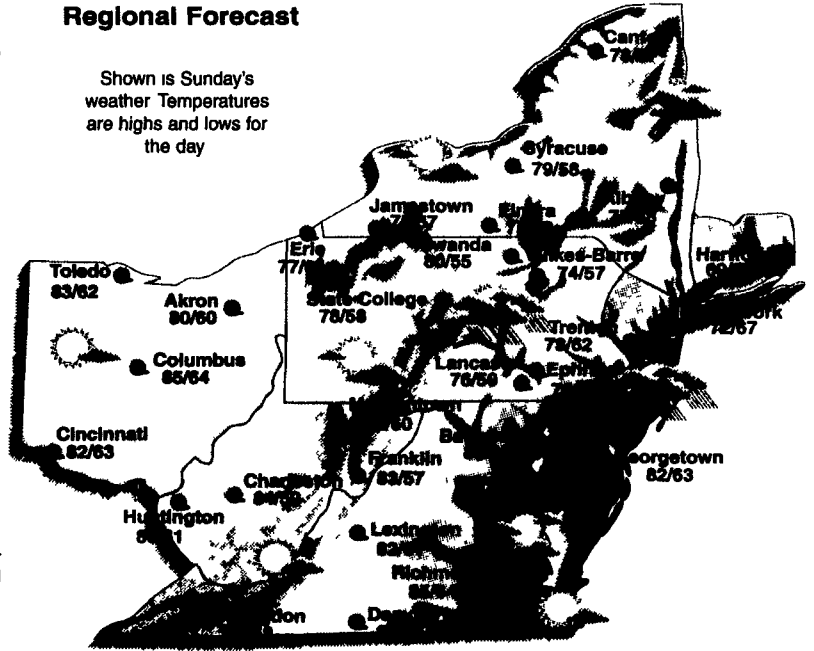

**Farming Forecast**  
 A transition day coming up on Sunday as an upper-level low begins to move east and offshore, bringing clouds and a shower or two, especially early. Average humidity will be 80 percent in the morning, but will fall to 50 percent in the afternoon. The topsoil will dry out this coming week with some dry days and warm temperatures. Highs will reach well into the 80s Monday through Thursday.

Shown is Sunday's weather. Temperatures are highs and lows for the day.



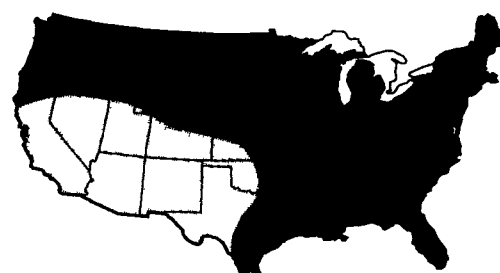

No one knows what summer will bring. Will we have enough heat units to finish a corn crop? Do you have enough forage on hand to wait for a corn crop? Sorghum sudans require heat as well, but cost much less to grow. The energy levels in BMR are similar to corn silage with approximately twice the protein when harvested at 30-36 inches.

### Management Tips:

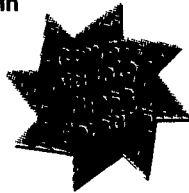
- Apply 75 units of Nitrogen at planting.
- Plant at 35-60 lbs per acre.
- Seed depth approximately 1"
- For Super Feed Quality:**  
Harvest for balage at 30"  
For silage at 36"  
For grazing at 18"
- Apply 50 units of Nitrogen after first cutting, or after second grazing.
- Approx. 30 days between cuts.
