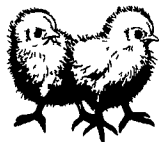

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds
was fair to moderate and generally suffi-
cient in keeping the bulk of offerings in
good balance. Live supplies were moder-
ate with weights ranging desirable to
heavy, mostly desirable. Processing sched-
ules were moderately heavy. Less than
trucklot asking prices were unchanged at
59 to 67 cents. Trade sentiment was
steady. In the parts complex, bone-in
breasts were readily available and slow to
clear; boneless skinless breasts were fully
sufficient. Leg items were mostly ade-
quate. Wings and tendersloins were avail-
able.

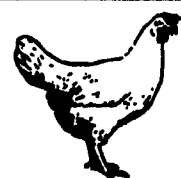
