Featured information will include agricultural production, business, and technology; poultry; environmental stewardship and natural resources; livestock; pasture management; food quality and safety; chemistry; pesticides; insects; plant diseases; home landscaping, horticulture and vegetable gardening; lawn care; value-added food products; birds; and bats. There will be displays, demonstrations, and seminars.

Families may enjoy the special events which include a cornfield maze, an aquaculture exhibit, a display of award-winning 4-H projects, archery and air-rifle ranges, egg incubation, butterfly gardens, and an interactive fishing simulator.

Children can enjoy the children's activity center. At the activity center children will learn about agriculture and foods originating in America while playing games, making and using puppets, and participating in interactive storytelling sessions. They can have their faces painted and have some fun on the toddler playground as well.

Walking and bus tours of Kentland Farm will give participants a chance to learn about the farm and its use for teaching, research, and Extension. Virginia Cooperative Extension will have a variety of displays to give visitors a chance to learn about the many educational programs offered throughout the Commonwealth.

Virginia Tech's Kentland Farm, where the event is to be conducted, is located along the New River a few miles west of the Blacksburg campus.
