NATIONAL CANNER FOWL MAR-KET: Majority prices were unchanged to slightly higher on both light and heavy canners when compared to a week earlier. Demand was mostly moderate for mostly light but sufficient offerings; additional heavy canners held with confidence. The undertone was seasonal but generally steady.

Cents per pound, current negotiations with out freight cost: LIGHT CANNER HENS: Line run without necks: 20-24, majority 23-24. HEAVY CANNER HENS: Without necks: 29-36, majority 32.5-34.

Cents per pound, current negotiations freight cost included: LIGHT CANNER HENS: Line run without necks 22-26, majority 25.5-26. HEAVY CANNER HENS: Without necks: 31.5-38, majority 34-36.5.

National Retail Egg Purchases Atlanta, Ga. July113, 2003

Report Supplied By USDA Cooperators estimate orders for the week ending July 18 will decrease by 7 percent. Present week purchases for the week ending July 11 were 235,297 cases which was 2 percent above the prior week

and 1 percent above estimates. CASES PURCHASED: CARTONED: 194,850 - up 1%; LOOSE: 40,438 - up 8%; TOTAL: 235,297 — up 2%.

Comparison figures are compiled on a matched plant basis. Purchases and estimates by 15 cooperators; 30 dozen cases or equivalent.
