Approximately 80% of the cattle marketed this week weighed over 600 lbs.Confirmed sales 500 this week, 900 last week and 250 last year.

YARDS, Weekly Cattle Summary ---Compared to last week: Feeder cattle and calves steady to 2.00 higher. Demand continues good for feeders. Calf demand good despite hot dry weather. Northern feedlots active buyers of heavy calves for grow lots. The trade was impressed with cattle on feed June marketing's and last week's strong feedlot movement. Nearby August-October Choice steer futures reacted .45-.65 up Monday. High pressure system continues to bake Oklahoma with highs reaching 110 in parts of the state during the past week. Over night lows Sunday night falling only into the low 90's. Slight reprieve moved in with cooler temps but still no rain.

Receipts this week 11.800; last week 14,564; last year 6,663. Supply consisted of 77% over 600 lbs; 18% calves; 5% cows and bulls. Heifers comprised 39% of feeder & calf supply.

## **Cattle On Feed 5 Percent Lower** Washington, D.C. July 18, 2003

**Report Supplied By USDA/NASS** Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 9.92 million head on July 1, 2003. The inventory was 5 percent below July 1,

2002 and 10 percent below July 1, 2001. The inventory included 6.11 million steers and steer calves, down 5 percent from the previous year. This group accounted for 62 percent of the total inventory. Heifers and heifer calves accounted for 3.75 million head, down 5 percent from 2002.

Placements in feedlots during June totaled 1.68 million, 2 percent above 2002 but 14 percent below 2001. Net placements were 1.62 million.

During June, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 374,000, 600-699 pounds were 361,000, 700-799 pounds were 483,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 464,000. Marketings 46 fed cattle during June totaled 2.23 million, 8 percent 40012 2902 and 5 percent above 2001.

Other disappearance totaled 61,000 during June, 20 percent above 2002 but 21 percent below 2001.

Cattle on feed July 1, 2003, from all feedlots in the United States, totaled 11.7 million, down 6 percent from the 12.4 million on July 1, 2002 and feed on July 1, 2003.

This was 1.0 percent higher than a week ago and 2.2 percent higher than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 0.2 percent lower compared to the previous year.


