## Nutrient Management Seminar Set For Md.

WYE MILLS, Md. — A Nutrient Management Summit scheduled for Aug. 5 will aim to streamline Maryland's Nutrient Management program and improve its effectiveness in protecting Maryland's water quality.

Maryland Governor Robert Ehrlich, Jr., has invited interested stakeholders to attend the summit and make nutrient management recommendations. People who should participate include farmers, nutrient management consultants, county officials, agricultural officials, environmental officials and anyone else interested in water quality protection.

In the morning, participants will brainstorm core elements of Maryland's Nutrient Management Program, including:

- Who should be covered by the law;
- enforcement strategy;
- nutrient management plan content; and
- recordkeeping requirements.

Consensus-building sessions will take place after lunch.

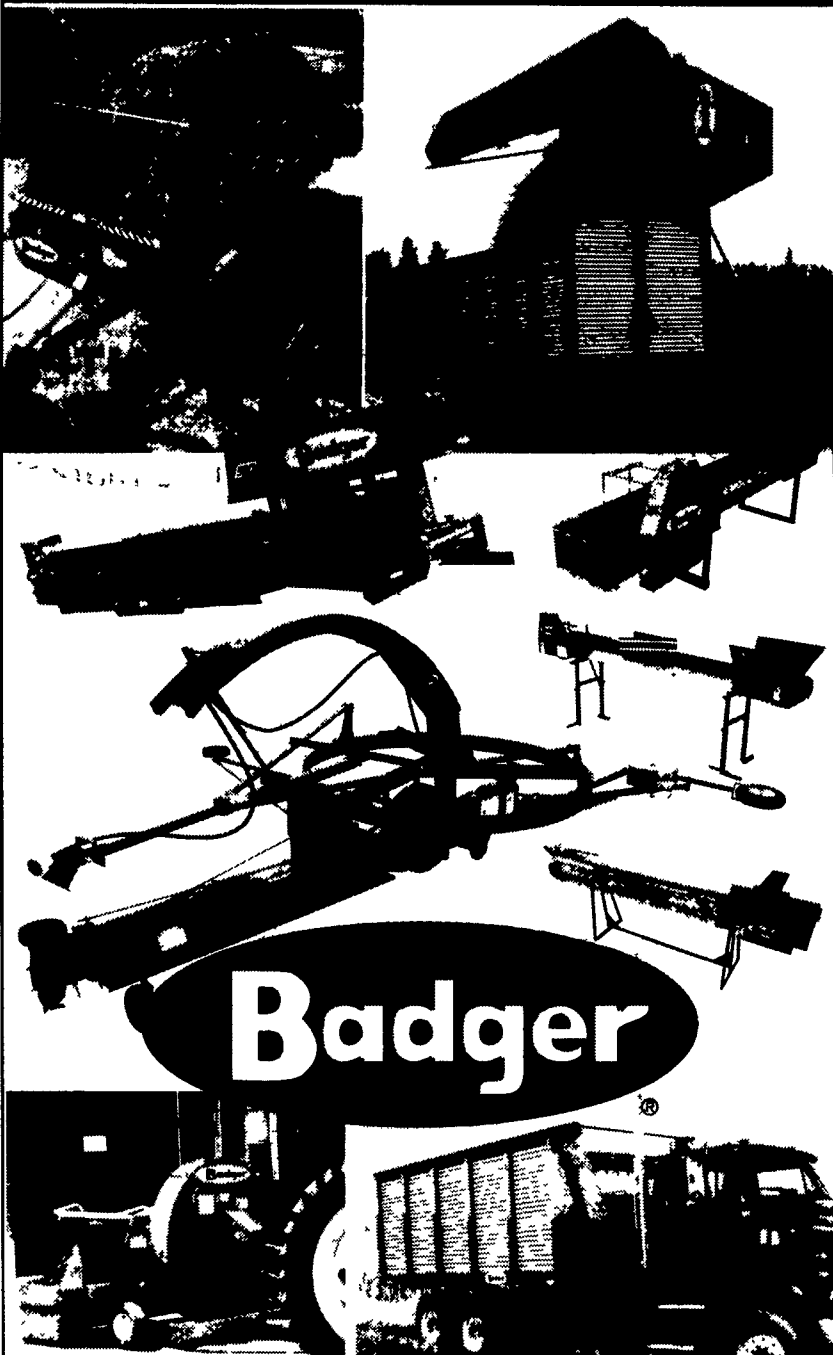
