Rutter's Guernseys Honored As Top Milk Producing Guernsey Herd

YORK (York Co.) — Rutter's Dairy, York, is home of the top milk-producing Guernsey herd in Pennsylvania and the eighth highest herd in the nation. This is the fourth straight year Rutter's received the Gold Star breeders' award at the recent National Guernsey Convention in Wisconsin. Only 21 herds in the nation received this award.

Rutter's Dairy is also home to

"Lily", the second place Guernsey in the country based on her milk production and appearance. Lily was bestowed the honor of "Milk Flow Queen" for 2002 by the American Guernsey Cattle Club.

Lily also tied for the seventh highest milk-producing Guernsey in the country and was first in the nation for milk production among Guernseys shown by jun-

ior breeders (breeders under 21 years of age).

Lily is shown by Terri Johnson, daughter of Tommy and Cindy Rutter Johnson and granddaughter of Leo and Marge Rutter.

The trio of Lily, her mother, and her sister placed third in the country for their combined milk production records.

Dairy Grazier To Host Pasture Walk

WATSONTOWN (Northumberland Co.) — David Zook will host a pasture walk on his Watsonstown farm Aug. 8 from 10 a.m. to noon.

Zook intensively grazes 50 Holsteins on 50 acres of pasture, and makes about 25 acres of hay.

Pasture species on the farm in-

clude orchardgrass, perennial ryegrass, bromegrass, and clovers.

The farm is located north of Dewart. From Rt. 405, turn onto Musser Lane and travel a quarter mile to the first farm on the left. From Rt. 54, a few miles west of I-180, take Musser lane to the west and go 1.75 miles to farm on

the right.

Producers attending the pasture walk are urged to take biosecurity precautions: wear different shoes than those worn around home cattle, and wear clothing that has been laundered since being around cattle.
