Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained centered on the generally well balanced to tight supply of 3.50 and 4.00 pound sizes; 2.50 and 3.00 pound sizes were readily available and slow to clear. Live supplies were mostly moderate; weights were desirable to light. Processing schedules were about moderate. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 59 to 68 cents. Trade sentiment was at least steady on the larger sizes; barely steady to weak on the lighter. In the parts complex, supplies were adequate for immediate delivery.

DOMESTIC MARKET HIGH-LIGHTS: The market tone on 8-16 lb hens and 16-24 lb toms remains about steady. No trading was reported. Demand was light as buyers continue to be in a wait and see mode. Offerings are adequate to ample for current needs. Bulk parts trading was light to moderate, meats was inactive. Demand was limited

as domestic buyers keep inventories close. EXPORT MARKET HIGHLIGHTS: Trading and demand was light to moderate. Trading centered on thigh meat and tom drums, balance slow. Interest noted from Russia, Mexico and Asia.
