Lebanon Area Fair's 2003 Vegetable Quick Bread Contest

LEBANON (Lebanon Co.) ---Warm up your oven and get ready to submit your vegetable bread creation to the Lebanon Area Fair Quick Bread Contest. The Pennsylvania "Simply Delicious" Vegetable Quick Bread Contest will be conducted during the Lebanon Area Fair on Monday, July 28.

Entries should be brought to the Lebanon Area Fair office at Cornwall and Rocherty Roads in Lebanon on the day of the contest between 10 a.m. and noon.

The vegetable bread recipe must include at least one or

more of the following Pennsylvania grown vegetables: asparagus, beans, beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, cucumber, greens, eggplant, garlic, horseradish, leeks, onion, parsley, peas, pepper, pumpkin, spinach, summer squash, zucchini, sweet corn, sweet potatoes, tomatoes, turnip, or winter squash.

To qualify, you must be a resident of Pennsylvania and must present your recipe with the entry. There is no entry fee and pre-registration is not required.

To enter, bring one loaf of

quick (non-yeast) bread baked in a 9×5-inch pan and displayed on a paper plate or cardboard. Quick breads will be judged on the overall appearance, texture and doneness, flavor, and creativity.

Winners will be announced at 2 p.m. on Monday, July 28.
