Veal production was 4.75 million pounds live weight, down 8 percent. Calf slaughter of 13,600 head was down 6 percent from June 2002, and average live weight decreased 10 pounds to 348 pounds.

Pork production was 54.2 million pounds live weight, up 15 percent from last year. Total head slaughtered was 219,500 up 13 percent from 2002. Average live weight was 247 pounds, up 5 pounds compared to June last year.

Lamb and mutton production was 596,000 pounds live weight, up 32 percent from June 2002. The number slaughtered was 5,800, up 26 percent. Average live weight was 103 pounds, up 5 pounds from last year.

Pa. Milk Production **Down 4 Percent In June** Harrisburg, Pa.

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Milk production in Pennsylvania during June 2003 totaled 855 million pounds, 4 percent below last year's production, according to the Pennsylvania Agricultural Statistics Service (PASS).

The number of milk cows in the state during the month averaged 578,000 head. 2,000 head more than May, but 4,000 less than June 2002. Production per cow averaged 1,480 pounds in June, unchanged from June 2002.

Milk production in the 20 states surveyed during June 2003 totaled 12.3 billion pounds, down 0.1 percent from June 2002. The number of milk cows on farms averaged 7.77 million head, 10,000 head less than June 2002, and 11,000 head less than May 2003. Production per cow averaged 1,587 pounds for June, unchanged from June 2002.

The quarterly production of milk for the U.S. was 43.9 billion pounds, down 0.3 percent from the April-June period last year. The average number of milk cows in the U.S. during the April-June quarter was 9.11 million head, 35,000 head less than the same period last year.
