For the 47th year, the Lebanon Area Fair Board offered the same great competitions as usual, but managed to include more opportunities for participation.

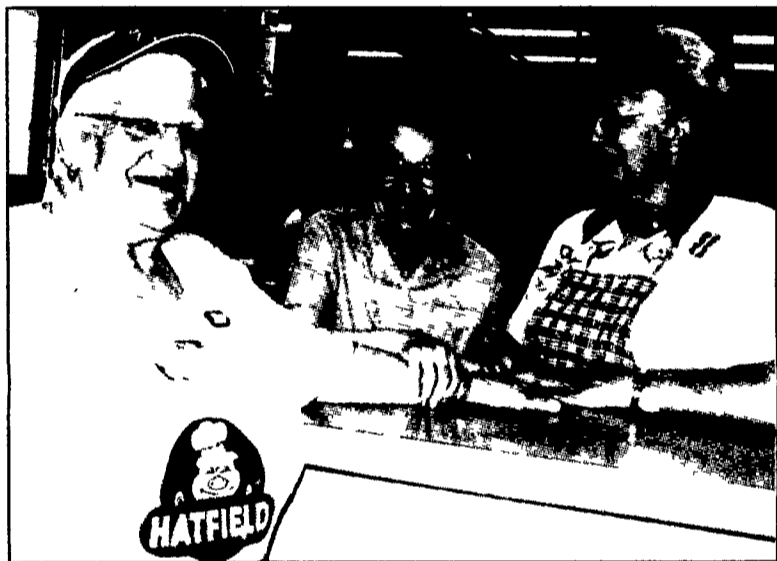
More than \$50,000 in premiums were distributed to winners in competitions scheduled from July 26-Aug. 2.
