
Poll-Ettes Awards Founders Scholarships

More than 1,400 buyers are expected to be present during the course of the day. Buyer numbers will be available in the main banquet facility beginning at 7 a.m. prior to the sale. A valid driver's license is necessary to register for


checks must be accompanied by a bank letter.

Sellers can consign farm equipment and machinery on Thursday, Aug. 21, from noon-8 p.m. and Friday, Aug. 22, from 8 a.m.-8 p.m.

Household and lawn and garden items will be accepted Thursday, Aug. 21 and Friday, Aug. 22, from noon-8 p.m. No items will be accepted the day of the sale. Commission structure will provided upon consignment registration.

Concessions will be available from various departments of the Berks County Grange during the auction. The Family Activities Committee will provide breakfast and lunch. The Youth Department will offer fries and the Junior Department will be selling hand-dipped ice cream.

Commissions retained by the Berks County Grange are used as an operating budget to fund various community needs and appeals.
