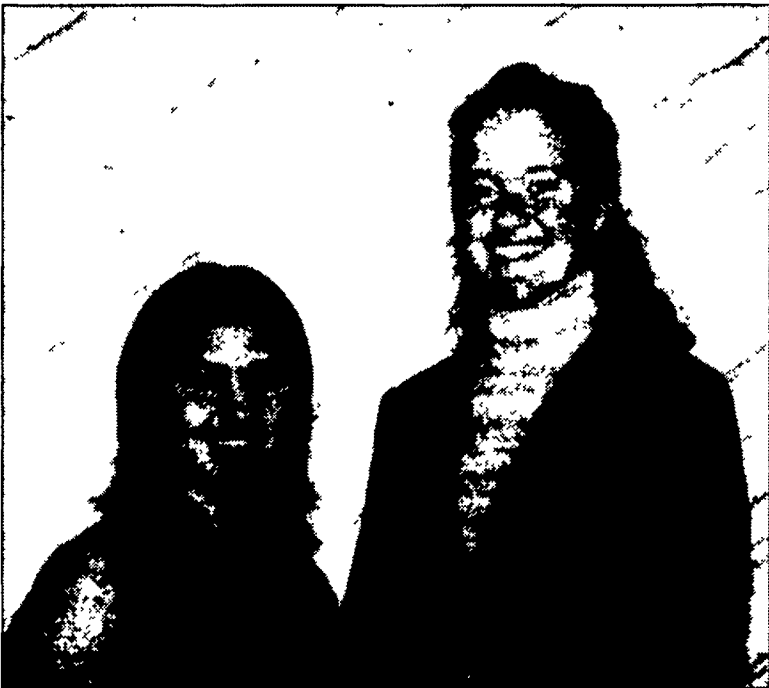




# 4-H HAPPENINGS

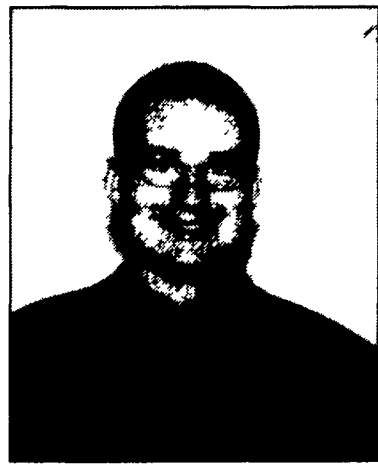
John Ocker also reviewed the rules and regulations for the Shippensburg Fair and other area shows coming up.


### Strasburg Teen Attends Ambassador Conference
