John Pfeiffer, Mulhall, Okla., entered the reserve grand champion carcass steer. The winning entry weighed in at 1,178 pounds and posted a carcass weight of 723 pounds. The steer had a fat thickness of 0.30-inch and a 13-inch ribeye. The steer graded low prime with a yield grade of 2.24 and qualified for CAB Prime.




