West End Fair Livestock Sale Grosses \$68,240

The 25th annual Union County West End Fair Junior Livestock Sale was conducted in Laurelton on Friday. Fifty-four different members of several Union County 4-H Clubs and the Mifflinburg FFA Chapter sold animals at the sale. A total of 113 lots containing 13 steers, 50 market hogs, and 50 market lambs were sold.
