

PEARLS BEFORE SWINE

Like casting pearls before swine, early Americans used to feed caviar to their pigs before learning that the fish eggs found in the "poor folks' diet" of sturgeon were the same delicate roe that could be imported from Russia. By the mid-1800s, American sturgeon was beginning to find its place on the gourmet's menu, and the roe was being salted and packed as caviar. Previously, the same tasty morsels were also used as fish bait for eels and perch, and for common compost.

If you've had trouble with ants, repel them by planting tansy around your foundation.


TERIYAKI GRILLED FISH

Marinade:
1/3 cup tamari soy sauce
1/3 cup vegetable oil
3 cloves garlic, minced
1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger
1/4 cup apple juice
1 tablespoon sugar

Mix marinade ingredients, pour over fish, and chill for at least an hour. Grill the fish, basting occasionally with the marinade, or bake in a greased pan at 350°F for 20 minutes. Garnish with the scallions and serve over rice.

2 pounds fish fillets
chopped scallions, to garnish

Makes 4 to 6 servings.
