kept buyers interested The farmer/feeders that held their ground over the past few weeks as prices were beginning to slide sure reaped the benefit of putting the extra finish on them as Prime steers once again topped at nearly 87.00 on Thursday; with kosher buyers thrilled to have the good quality steers to fill their loads Holstein steers sold firm to 2.00 higher as packer buyers went in search of the spotted stock to cheapen up their colored loads a little. A light test of slaughter heifers sold 1.00-2.00 higher as well. Fleshier (65-75 percent lean) slaughter cows sold mostly steady, instances firmer. Boning cows sold firm to 1.00 higher. Lean slaughter cow sold weak to 2.00 lower as buyer attendance was lighter than normal.
