Compared to last week US1-2 21-26 lb slaughter pigs sold 20.00-40.00 lower. All other weights within the U.S. 1-2, and U.S. 2 supply were not well tested. However, there was definitely a higher undertone noted on the Number 2 pigs, as well as in the no-grade and as-is supplies. Bidding activity was relatively good, although buyer attendance was light. All pigs continue to go to slaughter as mandated. Pigs consigned to the Wednesday sale are graded on arrival, and sold on their in-weights. Prices are quoted per hundred weight.
