Trade sentiment was mostly steady except for the Northeast which was mixed depending on product size. Retail demand was light to moderate with limited features. Food service was slow to fairly good, best into fast food for promotions. Supplies were usually sufficient; however, in the East, smaller sizes were adequate to close, but heavier weights were available and often discounted. In the Midwest following the blackout, shortages were noted due to delivery problems and schedules were irregular, but unsafe water was now confirmed potable. In the parts structure, trading was light to no better than fair, with the exception of wings which continued to have good movement and well cleared supplies. All other items were increasingly available. In production areas, live supplies were moderate. Weights were desirable to heavy, but mostly desirable.
