Organic Farming Group To Offer 'New Farmer Course' At N.J. College

you ever thought about starting a farm? New Jersey's proximity to large consumer markets offers tremendous opportunity for small-scale farm businesses, but the barriers to entry can be daunting.

A new course offered by the Northeast Organic Farming Association of New Jersey (NOFA-NJ) and Mercer County Community College (MCCC), promises to show would-be farmers that it can be done.

"Exploring the Small Farm Dream: Is Starting an Agricultural Business Right for You?" will begin on Sept. 9, from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. and will run for four consecutive Tuesday evenings.

Classroom sessions will be conducted at the Mercer County Community College West Windsor Campus, 1200 Old Trenton Road, West Windsor, NJ 08550. In addition to the evening sessions, a field trip to a successful small farm business in Mercer County will be arranged.

Instructors for the course will be Pam Flory, former farm manager at North Slope Farm in Lambertville and at Spring Hill Farm in Hopewell, and Laura Sayre, program manager at

PENNINGTON, N.J. — Have NOFA-NJ and a former employee at the Watershed Organic Farm in Pennington.

"Starting a farm business like starting any business — involves risk, but it can be extremely rewarding," said NOFA-NJ's executive director, Karen Anderson. "Our hope is that this class will help people make realistic projections about those risks and rewards, and move toward their goal of working the land. Demand for locally-grown and organic produce in this region is rapidly outpacing supply, so one of our major goals as an organization is to help new farmers enter the field."

The Exploring the Small Farm Dream curriculum was originally developed by the New England Small Farm Institute, a non-profit organization providing educational and other resources to beginning, limited-resource, parttime, and small-scale farmers in the northeast. Funding to bring the course to New Jersey was provided in part by First Pioneer Farm Credit's AgEnhancement Program.

Tuition for the course is \$150 including materials, although two people working on the same farm business idea may attend for a single tuition of \$170, including two copies of all course materials. Sign-up begins Sept. 2 for the 23 counties, which make up Pennsylvania's upper Susquehanna River basin from the central part of the state north to the New York border.

The first CREP was announced three years ago for 100,000 acres in 20 Pennsylvania

> counties in the southcentral part of the state. The expanded CREP includes all 43 Pennsylvania counties in the Chesapeake Bay watershed.

> CREP is a voluntary program that pays participants to plant hardwood trees or establish grass filter strips, riparian forest buffers, vegetation, streambank fencing, and other conservation practices on environmentally sensitive land. In return, participants receive annual rental payments, cost-share assistance, and other financial incentives.
