Pa. Receives \$3.9 Million For Farmland Preservation

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Agriculture Secretary Dennis C. Wolff and Douglas J. Lawrence, of the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, announced on Thursday that Pennsylvania will receive \$3.9 million in federal funds for farmland preservation this year, Pennsylvania's largest annual award to date and the top award in the nation for 2003.

"Pennsylvania leads the nation in the number of acres of prime farmland being protected and maintained for production agriculture," said Wolff. "Since 1996, when the federal government began reimbursing states for farmland it preserves, Pennsylvania has received nearly \$5 million to purchase 72 agriculture conservation easements across the commonwealth. The funding commitment we are receiving today will significantly enhance our efforts to maintain prime farmland and strengthen Pennsylvania's agricultural economy."

More than 13,400 acres of prime Pennsylvania farmland have been preserved under the federal program.

On Thursday, the Pennsylvania Agricultural Land Preservation Board was expected to vote on preserving 50 additional farms, totaling 5,339 acres.
