the Allentown Fair. Fifty-three animals - 30 hogs, seven market steers, six lambs, and 10 dairy beef animals — went before 147 registered buvers.


Before the sale, however, a moment was silence was honored in memory of Dale Grim, 65, who passed away on July 22.
