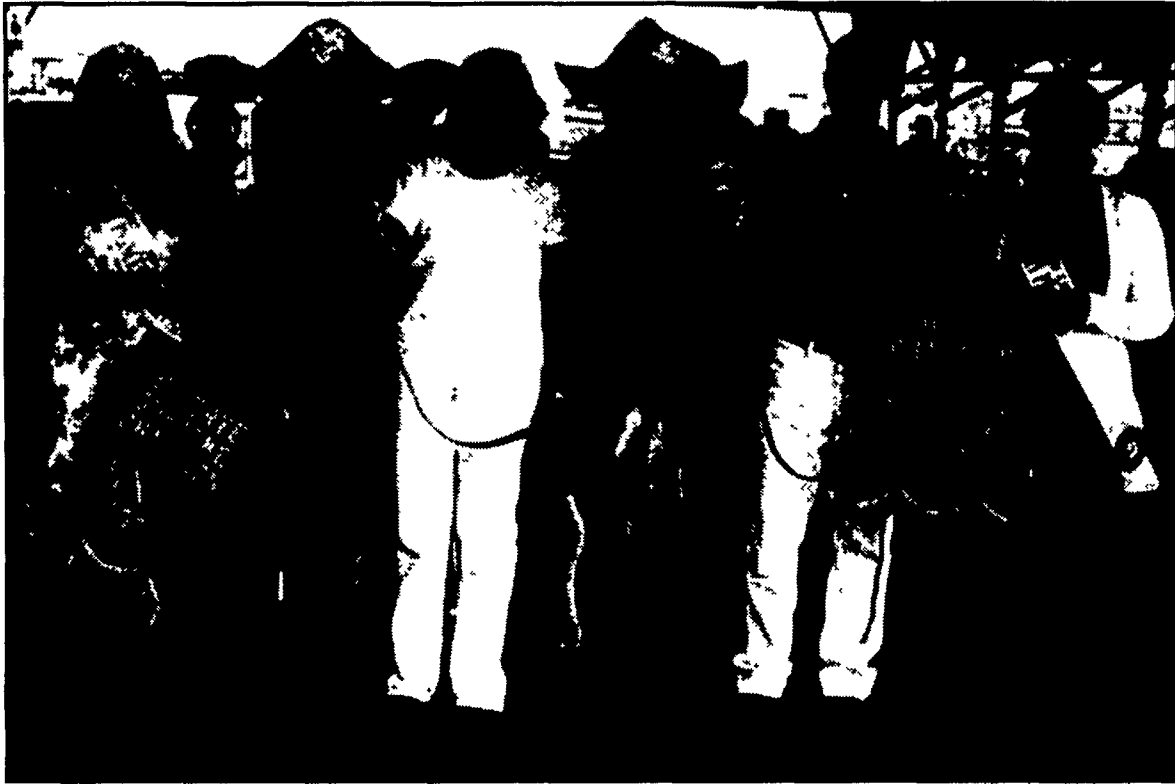

Jersey Named Supreme At Northeast 4-H/FFA District Dairy Show

Eleven-year-old Rebecca Black, of Liberty, Tioga County, paraded her senior two-year-old Jersey into the supreme champion spotlight at the recent 2003 Northeast Pennsylvania District 4-H and FFA show.

More than 200 calves and cows from seven breeds were entered in the two-ring show.

"Glenn and I looked at the cows when they were full of milk and we're looking at them now, and we agreed on the cow that had it all," said David Castrogiovanni as he and fellow judge Glenn Tripp pulled Pleasant Nook Flower Bud-ET into the center of the ring.

Although this award marks the first supreme champion for Black, she is no stranger in the show ring. In her three-year dairy career, Rebecca has won showmanship and fitting competitions and has stood in competition for the junior champion prize, receiving the reserve junior champion distinction once. She has shown animals on the county, district, and state levels.

"The most exciting thing for me about showing is when you first go into the ring," she said. "You never know what's going to happen."

Grand champions from each breed were in contention for the supreme champion prize. In the Ayrshire ring, Monica Franklin's

senior 2-year-old, Dazee View Spectacular Sassy, was the grand champion. The reserve grand champion Ayrshire was Amberleigh Yurkanin's aged cow, Wentworth-Farm Bonopaité Fawn. Junior champion Ayrshire was Kyle Sharer's spring calf, Heather-Brooke Pardner Pazazz, and the reserve junior champion was Kelsey Goodwin's winter calf, Locust Lane Savior Carlyn.

Abbie Kuhlman exhibited both the grand and reserve grand champion Brown Swiss. The grand champion was Victory Acres Naughty, a 4-year-old, and the reserve grand champion was Towpath Star Cara, a junior 3-year-old. Kurtis Page exhibited the junior champion Brown Swiss, fall yearling Rockyslope RL Banker Jentry. The reserve junior champion Brown Swiss

was Devon Jones's Buttons Atlas Geri, a winter calf.

In the Guernsey show, the junior champion, Ripley Blaze Lynn, a summer yearling owned by Erica Kuhlman, was also crowned the grand champion. The reserve junior champion was Andrea Yoder's winter calf, Janney May Legend Karen. Named senior champion and reserve grand champion was Adam Lutz's senior 3-year-old, Maple Knoll Lorry Tulip. The reserve senior champion was Andrea Yoder's dry cow, Maple Knoll Lorry Katlyn.

The grand champion Holstein was Rachel Bachman's junior 3-year-old, Wellwyn Encore Sandra. The reserve grand champion Holstein was Calkins Farm Pete Berachah, a 4-year-old owned by Randy Cal-

kins. The junior champion Holstein was Mary Mosher's fall calf, Norkval Encore Lyler, and the reserve junior champion was Del-Hollow Leduc Malika, a spring yearling owned by Jordan Snyder.

The reserve senior champion in the Jersey show was Hannah Bachman's junior 3-year-old, Fernlea of Wellwyn, while the junior champion Jersey award went to Maria Noble's senior yearling, Nobledale Perimeter Vernell-ET. The reserve junior champion was Philip Bachman's summer yearling.

The grand champion Milking Shorthorn was Samuel Cole's White's TC-3, a dry cow. The reserve grand champion and junior championship went to Katelynn
