Information to bring with you and recommendations for sampling: Bring bagged or tied whole corn silage plant samples (cut from ground at normal chop level) from several locations in a field. Include both the corn grain and forage portions. We will run

them through a bedding mulcher to reduce to a suitable size for Koster tester or microwave.

Bring a separate sample for each hybrid variety (note different hybrids mature at different rates) and for different maturity groups and planting dates.

As you start chopping, collect samples from chopped silage. We will check particle length (effective fiber), quality of processing (if using kernel processor), as well as moisture level.

Bring as much information with you about the following: planting date, hybrid type, maturity days, soil type, growing conditions, and topography (south slope, north slope, valley, etc.). We will summarize data with moistures and appearance and recommend estimated best harvest time range. Please note there is no registra-
